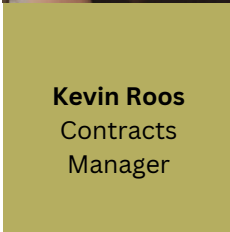

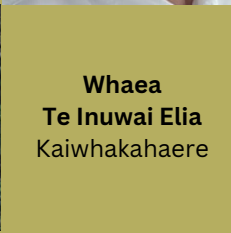

VICTORIA UNIVERSITY OF WAIKATO PERIPHERAL VEIN PROCREATION

This project is in its very early stage, the exact nature of any IP that will be generated, or even the key individuals that may contribute to its generation. However, the ownership arrangement of all relevant IP that maybe generated from this research will follow the established lines of inventor input and contribution. Decisions around IP will be undertaken by the main contributors of the research team, including Edgar Rodriguez-Ramirez, Gillian McCarthy, and other contributing researchers (including Auckland Health and Iwi United Engaged), in consultation with a commercialisation manager and IP team from Wellington UniVentures. The team will regularly review the outputs of the research to ensure any IP is identified and decisions around the management of that IP is to the benefit of all parties involved.

Any background IP will remain in the ownership of any party making that IP available for the research, but agree to allow the IP to be used for the purposes of the project. Ownership and benefits of any commercialisation of new IP will reflect inventor input and contribution, and all parties agree to negotiate in good faith to this regard

He aha te mahi Rangahau - Doing Good Stuff



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WAIPAPA TAUMATA RAU LYMPHOEDEMA

This mahi is about reducing discomfort in patients who experience swelling and fluid retention after cancer surgeries, chemo, or other medical procedures.

Lymphoedema is defined as chronic swelling in the body that develops when lymph fluid (which carries important cells and chemical messages for the immune system and nutritional processes) is unable to drain properly through the lymphatic system. It can often result after cancer treatment, especially breast cancer surgery or radiotherapy.

Dr Haley Reynolds' research team at Waipapa Taumata Rau (University of Auckland)'s, Auckland Bioengineering Institute are using medical dyes and specialised lighting and photography to map and identify areas where this swelling is occurring. Work is being done to develop a diagnostic tool which communicates valuable information to patients and healthcare workers, providing information to support important decisions in caring for the condition in a personalised way.

Future studies are planned for Middlemore Hospital, and Maaori and Pasifika engagement, co-design, and collaborations are established and growing.

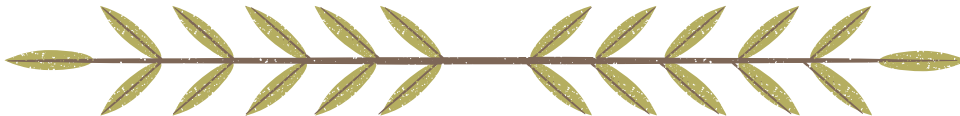

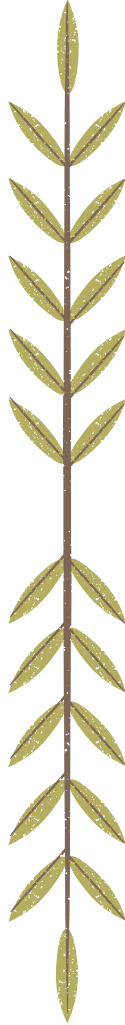
