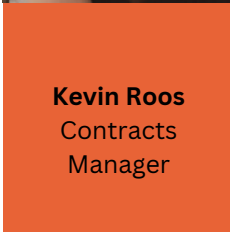

The Inner Ear Optic Diagnostic Project to Understand Hearing Loss

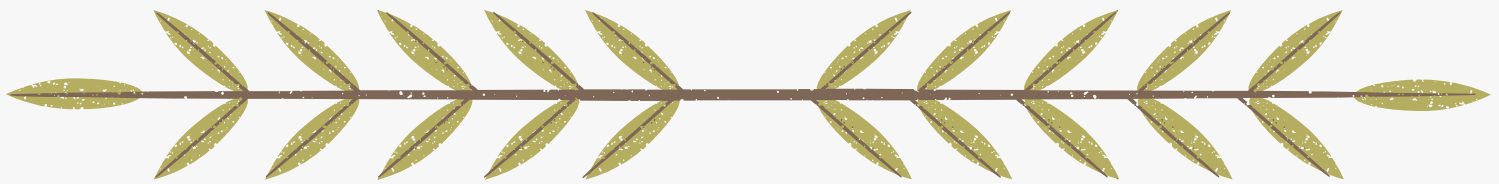
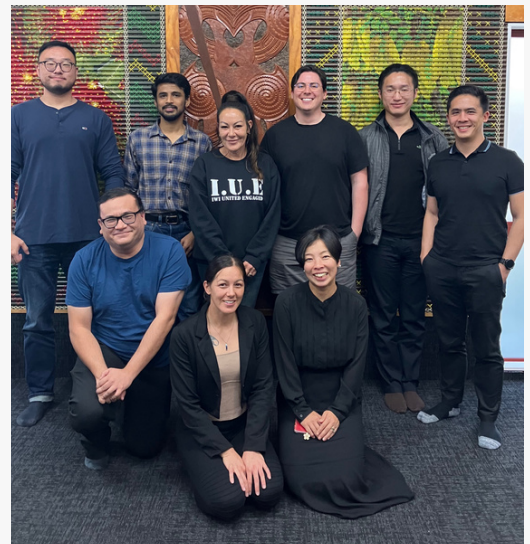
The Inner Ear Optic Diagnostic Project team is working in partnership with IUE to develop a new medical device that can help understand why some of us develop hearing loss.

Hearing loss affects one in six grown-ups in Aotearoa. We "hear" the sound in our organ of hearing called the "cochlea." The cochlea is part of our inner ear, is small (~1cm), and is buried in our skull. It's hard to see what's going on inside the cochlea, and this is why we don't fully understand what causes hearing loss in people.

With funding support from Te Titoki Mataora, Dr. Suzuki-Kerr and the team at the University of Auckland are working in partnership with IUE and clinical colleagues to develop a novel medical device that can visualize what's going on inside the cochlea. Some exciting experiments are happening in the laboratories of the University of Auckland to test the use of light-based technologies on the cochlea.

While the research is at an early stage, we are also reaching out to our whaanau to learn the best way to develop this novel device in partnership with the community toward its future use.

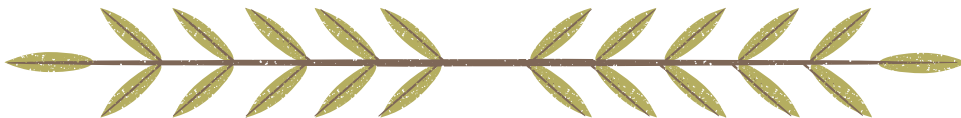

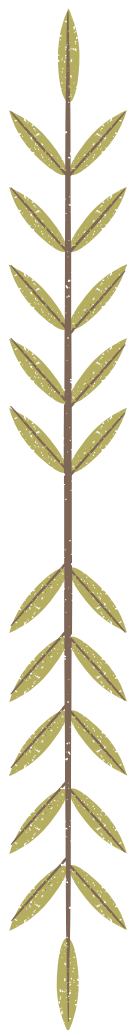
