Tino Rangatiratanga Overall aim: Provides for Māori self-determination and mana Motuhake (the right for Māori to be Māori) in the consent, gathering and analysis of data. Data sovereignty	Equity Elements Involved: Commitment to achieving equitable health outcomes for Māori whānau, hapu and iwi. Kaupapa Māori quantitative theory	Active Protection Direction: To act, to achieve equitable health outcomes for Māori, including ensuring that Māori are well informed on the extent, and nature, of both Māori health outcomes and efforts to achieve Māori health equity. Good data vs data harm	Partnership Key threads: Requires researches and Māori to work in partnership in the governance of the consent, gathering, analysis and destruction of data Māori must regain tino rangatiratanga Te Tiriti o Waitangi	Options Pathways: This requires researchers to provide for and properly resource Kaupapa Māori engagement and participation in research, ensuring culturally appropriate processes.
